


# **Volunteer Service Statistics**


#### Volunteers

- 100 volunteers that range in age from 16-94
  - 2 volunteers over the age of 90, one of which is
     94
- 3 different types: Adults, Students, and Craft
- New volunteer applicant numbers rose markedly late in the year

### Hours

- 17,935 hours volunteered this year
  - Equivalent to nearly 9 FTE's
- 4 volunteers with over 500 hours in 2022 and 5 more with over 400 hours
- Sewing donations accounted for over 2200 hours

- \$537,153 in total monetary value
- In 2021, volunteer time was worth \$29.95 per hour



















