Program Requirements

- Submit an Essay with the application:**
 - In 200 words or less, explain why you want to become a medical assistant or why you would like to work in the healthcare profession. Strong English and communication skills are required.
- Must be 18 or older. If under 18, must have parental consent.
- Minimum education: High school diploma or equivalent or will obtain a high school diploma simultaneously with the medical assistant certification. Must submit a copy or proof.
- Required Immunizations:
 - Flu Shot
 - MMR and Varicella titer or vaccine proof
 - Hep B: Must complete first of the series of 3
 - 2-step TB or QuantiFERON Gold will be given during class
 - 1 J&J or 2 Moderna or Pfizer COVID vaccines
- MHP office tour: Date to be determined
- Professionalism:
 - Understand and follow the code of conduct as outlined in this application.
 - Applicant may be asked to participate in a mock interview.
 - Professionalism will be evaluated weekly and will determine suitability for externship.
- 160-hour externship: Student must meet qualifications and successfully complete externship in order to graduate the training program.
- MHP employee applicants: Must be employed for at least 6 months before applying to this MA Training Program and have a recommendation from your supervisor.

This program prepares medical assistant students to perform patient clinical skills in various medical office settings. A medical assistant may perform clinical procedures, such as:

- taking medical histories and recording vital signs
- preparing patients for examination
- assisting the physician during the examination
- explaining treatment procedures to patients

- administering medications as directed by a physician
- performing an electrocardiogram
- assisting with minor surgery, change dressings
- obtaining laboratory specimens for testing, such as drawing blood
- educating patients about medication and special diets
- authorize drug refills as directed, telephone prescriptions to a pharmacy
- maintaining clinical equipment in an ambulatory care setting

Policies: A student of the Medical Assistant certificate program must:

- Have 100% attendance.
- Discuss any absence with the course instructor or your externship coordinator.
- Display required skills and abilities: observation, communication, motor and behavioral maturity.
- Participate actively in all demonstrations, laboratory exercises, classroom activities and clinical experiences in all areas, clinical procedures, providing patient care, EKG lab and phlebotomy lab.
- Exercise good judgment, function effectively under stress, adapt to changing environments and provide professional and sensitive care to classmates and patients.
